## EDUCATION, TRAINING, & OUTREACH

- 102,000 students trained in safe gun handling.
- 13,000 instructors & Range Safety Officers certified through advanced instruction.
- 55 new Training Counselors certified to train instructors.
- Training opportunities now combine online coursework with in-person range instruction, allowing students to learn safely & conveniently.
- Instructional materials updated across multiple disciplines, including home firearm safety, muzzleloading, & pistol training.
- Volunteer coaches from the NRA National Coach Development Staff conducted 24 training clinics.
- Awarded over 160 new Distinguished Experts or above in the NRA Marksmanship Qualification Program.
- 240,000 children reached through the Eddie Eagle GunSafe® Program.
- 1,100 program partners in 25 states delivered the Eddie Eagle firearm safety message with materials available in English & Spanish.
- 250 Women on Target clinics introduced 2,500 new female shooters to firearms & outdoor skills.
- The NRA Youth Education Summit brought 32 high school students to Washington, DC, & awarded \$34,000 in college scholarships.
- Celebrated the 18th year of the Youth Shooting Sports Ambassadors with two exceptional high school students.
- 1,200 Eagle Scouts were recognized for their achievement.
- \$10,000 awarded through the Outstanding Achievement Youth Awards to young leaders in the shooting sports.

## SHOOTING SPORTS & ACCESSIBILITY

- Launched America's Rifle Challenge, a nationwide competitive shooting discipline, attracting a new skillset of shooters.
- Held national championships across multiple disciplines, including Smallbore, High Power, Silhouette, & Precision Pistol.
- Support provided to local clubs for modernized tournament registration systems to simplify event participation & reduce costs.
- Adaptive Shooting Programs provides support to NRA competitive shooting to accommodate shooters who need waivers to participate in upcoming matches on local, regional, state, & national matches.
- The Range Accessibility Subsidy provides a grant of up to \$2,500 per year to ranges committed to making their facilities accessible.
- Developed a resource directory for adaptive shooting equipment & hunting opportunities.
- Created a range accessibility checklist to help ranges voluntarily comply with the Americans with Disabilities Act.

# HUNTING, CONSERVATION, & COMMUNITY IMPACT

- 49,000 students completed the NRA Online Hunter Education.
- NRA's Online Hunter Education is now accepted in 16 states.
- The Youth Hunter Education Challenge welcomed nearly 3,500 participants, teaching safe hunting practices & outdoor skills.
- Donated venison provided 8.1 million meals to food banks, shelters, & community organizations nationwide in partnership with over 50 affiliates through Hunters for the Hungry.
- Awarded \$15,000 in prizes to 13 youth artists in the 30th year of the George Montgomery/NRA Youth Wildlife Art Contest, after judging over 650 entries.

# MEMBERSHIP, EVENTS, & PARTNERSHIPS

- 5,000 clubs & associations maintain their affiliation nationwide, representing nearly one million NRA members.
- The NRA Business Alliance supports 2,500 firearm-friendly businesses.
- Awarded over \$54,000 in grants to 18 official State Associations for operational expenses.
- Friends of NRA State Fund Committees awarded \$8.7 million in grants nationwide.
- Range development programs supported 72 ranges nationwide & awarded \$275,000 in grants to improve shooting facilities.
- 1,400 new law enforcement firearms instructors trained.
- 9,000 active NRA-certified law enforcement instructors.
- More than 570 law enforcement & security agencies maintain affiliations with NRA programs.
- NRA School Shield trained 170 security professionals in conducting school safety vulnerability assessments.

- Honored fallen officers by providing \$35,000 Line of Duty Death Benefits to their families.
- 80,000 members attended the NRA Annual Meeting & Exhibits in Atlanta.
- 200,000 visitors attended the Great American Outdoor Show, the largest outdoor show in the United States.
- NRA Day welcomed over 7,800 participants in 124 different communities.
- The National Firearms Museum in Virginia welcomed 16,600 visitors this year.
- The National Sporting Arms Museum in Missouri averaged 25,000 visitors a week.
- NRA Museums preserve over 10,000 historic firearms & artifacts.
